1. This country's flag is striped with red and white with a maple leaf in the middle. Horseshoe Falls and Bridal Veil Falls are parts of this country's famous Niagara Falls, in its province of Ontario. What country is this?
2. Rivers to the east of this mountain range drain into the Atlantic Ocean and on the west they drain into the Pacific. These mountains run through Canada and US states like Utah and Montana. What mountain range is this, naming a national park in Colorado?
3. This city on the Atlantic Ocean is the biggest in the US. It's divided into five sections called boroughs, and is separated by rivers like the Hudson and the East. What city is this, nicknamed the "Big Apple"?
4. Once as tall as the Rocky Mountains, this range has been worn down over millions of years. Starting up in Canada, these mountains stretch down into Georgia and Alabama. What's the name of these mountains in eastern North America?
5. This artificial canal, finished in 1914, uses a series of locks to carry ships from the Pacific Ocean to the Atlantic Ocean. What's the name of this waterway, crossing a country of the same name?
6. An observation deck on this city's CN Tower provides views over nearby Lake Ontario, one of the Great Lakes. Even though it's the biggest in Canada, this city isn't the country's capital. What is the name of this Canadian city?
7. Two groups of islands, the Greater and Lesser Antilles, separate this sea from the Atlantic Ocean. Some of the island countries in this sea include Jamaica and Barbados, and are popular tourist destinations. What sea is this?

8. This bay, named after a famous English explorer, borders the Canadian provinces of Manitoba, Ontario, and Quebec. Churchill, a town known as the “Polar Bear Capital of the World,” is on the western shore of this bay. What bay is this?

9. In the north of this country is the Monteverde Cloud Forest, home to thousands of plant species and many unique birds and reptiles. What country is this, south of Nicaragua and whose capital is San Jose?

10. Running through the American Southwest, this river carved the Grand Canyon along its course to empty into the Gulf of California. What river is this, sharing its name with a US state?

11. This river starts in Minnesota’s Lake Itasca and flows south to the Gulf of Mexico. Even though it often floods, many cities like Memphis and New Orleans sit along this river. What river is this, giving its name to a southern US state?

12. A species of very tall cactus called the saguaro is found across this desert. This desert sits at the north end of the Gulf of California, and extends across parts of Mexico and the southwestern US. What desert is this?

13. This peninsula separates the Gulf of Mexico from the Caribbean Sea, and includes parts of Mexico, Belize, and Guatemala. What peninsula is this, the site of ancient Maya cities like Tikal and Chichen Itza?
