

Where Am I?

1. In this city, I might order meatballs called kofta and visit a traditional hammam or bathhouse. I could also see the Hagia Sophia, a building that has been a church and a mosque. This city is split in half between Europe and Asia, and was called Constantinople in the past. Where am I?
2. Here, I'm able to wander through Chapultepec Park or visit the ancient ruins of nearby Teotihuacan. Now the capital of its country, the city where I am was built on a dried lake bed by the Aztec civilization. Where am I?
3. In this city, I could go swimming at Copacabana Beach, then take a cable car up Sugarloaf Mountain. The city I'm in sits on the Atlantic Ocean, and it's home to a giant statue called Christ the Redeemer. Where am I?

10. This ancient city was once home to an empire that covered parts of Europe, Asia, and Africa. Here, I’m able to go for a walk along the Tiber River or peek inside the Pantheon, a domed temple that’s now a Catholic church. Where am I?
